AP Program

- Courses offered at all grade levels
- 35 different AP Courses available
- Almost 65% of Classroom teachers have a Gifted Endorsement to teach Honors and AP Classes

International Spanish Academy (ISA)

- A rigorous Humanities program of study for Spanish Language learners with approximately 30% of courses delivered in Spanish plus 4 yrs. of Spanish Language classes
- Apply to ISA during 8th grade year
- ISA graduates will earn a diploma from WHS and a diploma from Spain's Ministry of Education

- Offers 3 Majors: Advanced Mathematics and Science;
 Engineering, and Medicine
- Application to Major Cohort during 8th grade year
- Coursework will include one major course and one science elective course each year, adding a capstone Research project during their Senior year.

- For the sophomore year
- Freshman Advisement/Registration for classes First of March
- Deadline for waivers is first of May, summer changes cannot be accommodated

HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM


- Students register for next year's courses in the Spring
- Current teachers make recommendations in regard to course placement or level of course
- Students/parents may waive up or down one level
- Reach for the maximum level of coursework that is APPROPRIATE (based on teacher recommendation, student ability and student motivation)- BALANCE

CLASSES & FAMILY DISCUSSION

- During registration take the time to sit down with your child and discuss the classes recommended.
- A registration for coursework is a commitment to take the class. The master schedule is built based on student registration.
- Honors and Advanced Placement level courses place more emphasis on Critical Reading....which is measured in standardized testing such as the SAT



- If a bus does not come to your bus stop in the morning, please call Cobb County School Transportation. Walton cannot help with these issues.




Attendance Office: Late Arrival and Early Dismissal Procedures

- Email Attendance Office prior to an early dismissal and the office will send your child a pass to leave class early. If it is a last-minute early dismissal request, call the Attendance Office to notify the school of the departure.
- Email Attendance Office of late arrival and have your child checkin with the Attendance Office on the way into school so a pass can be issued. The parent does not need to enter the building in the event of a late arrival, only the student.


















STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN WEB

Option 1: Must Stay

-Verification Form Required – Accountability process in place and required tutoring will be documented.

Option 2: May Stay or Leave

-No Verification Form required – Students with parental permission may leave campus at WEB dismissal.

Cobb County Buses will run on their normal schedule on WEB days. Students leaving early must arrange their own transportation.

ACADEMIC INCENTIVE FOR FINALS

- Students who have an A average in a class prior to the final exams may exempt their final
- A maximum of finals in 2 classes may be exempted per semester

Prescription Drugs: Students can not carry prescription drugs on their person. (Exceptions: See nurse if your student has epi-pen, diabetic or asthma meds.) Parents must deliver prescription drugs, in original container, directly to the Clinic. Front office parent volunteers can not accept prescription drug drop off. Nurse Sandy will contact parents during preplanning regarding any medication drop offs



Over the Counter Medication: Students are allowed to carry a small, personal supply of OTC medications, in the original container. DO NOT BRING A ZIPLOCK BAG OF PILLS TO SCHOOL! Students are not allowed to share their OTC medication with other students. The Clinic does not have a supply of OTC medications...all OTC medications must be supplied by the parent.



Hydrate and fuel for Success: Send a refillable water bottle and healthy snack to school so your student can stay hydrated and fueled for optimal learning. There are hydration refill stations available and 6 minutes between classes.
