Diorama: a replica of a scene, typically a three-dimensional miniature model, Creating a book diorama is a fun and creative way to bring a story to life. By adding items gradually, your child(ren) can build up their diorama while enjoying the process.

Preparation: Start by selecting a shoebox or other small container. This will serve as the base for your project. You can also begin to sketch out your ideas and gather materials like colored paper, glue, and even items you find outside. Each week you will add to the diorama to display what is happening in the book. At your own pace, add additional characters to your diorama. You can use small figurines, paper cutouts, or even create your own characters out of clay. Place them in the scene to bring the story to life and add depth to your diorama. Creativity and imagination are key. There is no right or wrong way to make your diorama.
